- (1) Higher other income in 2Q2014 was due to payment from an insurance claim. Higher other income in 1H2014 was due to payouts under the Wage Credit Scheme and cash bonus received under the Productivity and Innovation Credit Scheme.
- (2) Lower selling and marketing expenses in 2Q2014 and 1H2014 were due to lower marketing vouchers purchased and lower payroll cost.
- (3) Lower other expenses in 2Q2014 were due to lower exchange losses. Higher other expenses in 1H2014 due to higher exchange losses and loss on disposal of property, plant and equipment.
- (4) Lower net finance costs in 2Q2014 and 1H2014 were mainly due to lower interest accretion from discounting long term dividend payable and higher interest income from bank deposits.
- (5) The effective tax rate in 2Q2014 and 1H2014 was lower with lower profit contribution from overseas entities that have higher statutory tax rates.
- (6) Lower staff costs in 1H2014 were mainly attributable to lower headcount with the completion of Engineering projects in Indonesia.
- (7) Higher directors' remuneration was approved by shareholders at the Company's Annual General Meeting held on 28 April 2014 (of which 15% of such remuneration have been paid in the form of restricted share awards that were granted pursuant to the TeleChoice restricted share plan).
- (8) Lower depreciation in 2Q2014 and 1H2014 was due to certain assets being fully depreciated.
- (9) Higher amortisation in 2Q2014 and 1H2014 was mainly due to the eplanet ecommerce portal.
- (10) Provision for bad debts in 2Q2014 was attributed to ICT customers whilst reversal of bad debts in 1H2014 was mainly attributed to a PCS customer. The provision for bad debts in 2Q2013 and 1H2013 was mainly attributed to a PCS customer.
- (11) Exchange losses in 2Q2014 and 1H2014 arose mainly from USD payables and cash balances. Exchange losses in 2Q2013 and 1H2013 arose mainly from intercompany loans denominated in SGD provided to subsidiaries in Malaysia mitigated by exchange gains from USD cash balances.

- **PCS** Revenue decreased by \$0.6M in 2Q2014 from lower prepaid card sales and sales to a major Singapore customer. The increase by \$11.7M in 1H2014 were from higher channel and regional sales offset by lower sales to a major Singapore customer as well as lower prepaid cards sales.
- ICT Revenue decreased by \$4.7M and \$6.8M in 2Q2014 and 1H2014 respectively mainly due to lower sales by S & I Systems Pte Ltd and NxGen Communications Pte Ltd mitigated by higher wholesale revenue.
- Engineering Revenue decreased by \$3.8M and \$6.2M in 2Q2014 and 1H2014 respectively were due to lower transmission equipment sales in Singapore and lower revenue recognition from Radio Network Planning projects in Indonesia.

- PCS PBT decreased by \$0.2M in 2Q2014 due to lower rebates received in 2Q2014. Higher PBT in 1H2014 by \$0.6M mainly from higher retail commission income from both Singapore and Malaysia operations.
- ICT Lower losses by \$0.2M in 2Q2014 was mainly due to lower operating expenses. Losses increased by \$0.1M in 1H2014 mainly due to lower revenue and gross profits.
- Engineering PBT was maintained at \$0.7M in 2Q2014 and higher in 1H2014 by \$0.2M with improvements in Singapore and Malaysia partially offset by lower profits contribution from Indonesia.

#### 9. VARIANCE FROM PROSPECT STATEMENT

#### 10. PROSPECTS

Based on the current outlook and barring any unforeseen circumstances, the Group expects 2H2014 operating performance to be better than 1H2014 with 2014 full year's operating performance to be maintained at last year's level.
